The curriculum leader will:

- Work with outside agencies to ensure provide of P.E. instruction - and extra-curricular clubs - is of the highest quality.
- Co-ordinate, and monitor, the school's engagement in sporting competitions, festivals and celebrations with other schools in the Local Authority and beyond.
- Work with the Headteacher to carefully plan, and implement, a broad and balanced P.E. curriculum.
- Devise, and routinely update, a subject improvement plan.
- Attend relevant CPD events and feedback their knowledge and understanding to the rest of the staff.
- Keep up-to-date with the latest subject developments.
- Undertake an annual audit and stock take of resources as well as purchase new resources when required in preparation for the new academic year.
- Manage the budget and sport premium funding effectively.
- Undertake risk assessments when required.
- Ensure sporting opportunities are presented to a wide-range of children throughout the school.

- Information for extra-curricular sports, athletics and dance clubs suited to the students' interests.

The class teacher will, with support from the curriculum leader:

- Comply with all aspects of the P.E. policy.
- Work closely with the subject leader to develop this policy.
- Devise medium and short term planning to ensure the delivery of varied, engaging and challenging P.E. lessons for all pupils.
- Celebrate the success of pupils in lessons and their achievements both when representing the school and those that are extra-curricular.
- Have high expectations for all children and provide tasks that will engage those most able.
- Promote the utilisation of cross-curricular skills, relevant to English and mathematics as well as all other subjects, throughout their delivery.
- Assess, record and report the development, progress and attainment of pupils both with the subject leader and children's families.
- Act as a role model for an active, healthy lifestyle.

Our children will be:

- Developing competence and skills to excel in a broad range of physical activities.
- Physically active for sustained periods of time throughout the school day.
- Engaged in competitive sports competitions and activities.
- Taught how to lead healthy, active lives.
- Presented with the opportunities to represent themselves, their house and our school in a variety of sporting and athletic festivals and competitions.
