- All pupils able to have access to wider experiences in school which are used as a springboard to inspire motivate and raise academic standards throughout the whole school.
- To provide a chronological phonetic programme to raise standards in decoding, reading and writing across all children including FSM.
- To focus on pupil self-confidence and self-esteem through group intervention
- To purchase resources to support different learning styles and needs.
